

NEW NAME & COMPANY REBRANDING

Patriot Battery Metals Inc., has decided to change its name to PMET Resources Inc., marking the next evolution of the Company, reflecting the broader endowment of Shaakichiuwaanaan.

The new logo, a three faced mineral crystal, is representative of the LCT components of Shaakichiuwaanaan's pegmatites – Lithium-Cesium-Tantalum.

The symbology of three also represents the three cultures on-site – French, English and Cree.




BALANCING DEVELOPMENT WITH SOCIAL & ENVIRONMENTAL NEEDS

The Shaakichiuwaanaan Mining Project is subject to a federal and provincial Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA). Both levels of government issued guidelines to be followed in preparing the ESIA report. The goal of the ESIA is to understand how the project might affect the environment and local communities.

- It looks at **all types of impacts**: negative, positive, or uncertain.
- It considers **different project phases** (construction, operation, closure).
- It includes the **protective measures** already built into the project design, as well as any extra steps planned to reduce impacts.

The impact analysis is done on the Valued Ecosystems Components (VECs). The VECs is intended to reflect Cree perspectives, values, traditional knowledge, and concerns shared during meetings and community consultation events. The list of VECs was validated with community members.



After the fillings of the ESIA reports the governments will review the documents, including representants of the Cree Nation Government. The Cree community members and the public will have the opportunity to participate in consultations activities and give feedback.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

In 2025, PMET had more than 60 communication activities with the Cree Nation of Chisasibi leadership, community members and the tallyman’s family.

In July and September, we had an in-person meeting with the Ratt Family to review the information on land use shared with PMET over the last two past years. We discussed the impact assessment methodology and reviewed the valued ecosystem components with the Family. We met the Chisasibi General Director and Niskamoon Corporation regarding fish compensation projects. We organized public information sessions at the Commercial Center and at the Mamoweedow festival on Fort George Island. Community members were invited to consult posters on different aspects of the Shaakichiuwaanaan Project. The purpose was to present the Shaakichiuwaanaan Mining Project under study, share data on the receiving environment, gather feedback and answer questions.

In August, members of the Ratt Family, accompanied by Deputy-Chief Mark Wadden, Chisasibi Natural Resources Liaison Officer Christopher Herodier, and PMET team members visited the Whabouchi Site (Nemaska Lithium). The participants were able to see surface infrastructure such as the construction camp, administrative building, garage, concrete plant, recycling/waste management facilities, roads, water treatment system, open pit, stockpiles, crusher, conveyors and ore treatment plant.
